Eight Reasons for an Earthly Kingdom

- 1. It is necessary in order to preserve the integrity of the character of God. Paraphrasing, if God can't restore what Satan and man have corrupted, He is a failure.
- 2. It is necessary to accomplish God's purpose of demonstrating His perfect government over the earth.
- 3. It is necessary in order to restore the original harmony between God and His creation, between the supernatural and the natural.
- 4. It is necessary in order to redeem the earth from the curse imposed upon it.


Eight Reasons for an Earthly Kingdom

- 5. It is necessary in order to fulfill all God's eternal covenants made with Israel (and Abraham).
- 6. It is necessary in order to provide a final test of fallen humanity.
- 7. It is necessary to make a full manifestation of the glory of Christ in the kingdom over which He rules.

- Rev 11:15 Then the seventh angel sounded; and there were loud voices in heaven, saying, "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ; and He will reign forever and ever." NASU
- · Zech 14:8-9 And in that day it shall be That living waters shall flow from Jerusalem, Half of them toward the eastern sea And half of them toward the western sea; In both summer and winter it shall occur. And the Lord shall be King over all the earth. In that day it shall be "The Lord is one," And His name one. NKJV

The Bible says so!

Isa 2:4 He shall judge between the nations, And rebuke many people; They shall beat their swords into plowshares, And their spears into pruning hooks; Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, Neither shall they learn war anymore. NKJV

The confusion

Luke 17:20-21 Now when He was asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, He answered them and said, "The kingdom of God does not come with observation; nor will they say, 'See here!' or 'See there!' For indeed, the kingdom of God is within you." NKJV

According to Thomas Constable:

"The NIV translation "within you" (Gr. entos hymon) is unfortunate because it implies a spiritual reign within people. The Old Testament teaching concerning the messianic kingdom was uniformly an earthly reign that included universal submission to God's authority. Nowhere else does the Old or New Testament speak of the kingdom as something internal. Besides, even if the kingdom were internal, it would hardly have been "within" the unbelieving Pharisees whom Jesus was addressing. It was "in their midst" or "among them," in that the Messiah was standing right in their presence. If they had believed on Him, the kingdom would have begun shortly, immediately after Jesus' death, burial, resurrection, ascension, the Tribulation (cf. Dan 9:24-27), and His return. It was within their reach."

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Others say

- "You look around for the Messiah as though he were absent, but he is amongst you in the midst of you." (from Geneva Notes, PC Study Bible formatted electronic database Copyright © 2003, 2005, 2006 Biblesoft, Inc. All rights reserved.)
- "These Pharisees asked when the kingdom would be set up, and Jesus said the kingdom is here now, and you have not eyes to see. The kingdom of God is among you. The King Himself is here, attended by the members of His cabinet." (from Ironside Commentaries, PC Study Bible formatted electronic database Copyright © 2012 by Biblesoft, Inc. All rights reserved.)
- "Meantime, the kingdom was actually in the midst of the Pharisees in the persons of the King and His disciples. MG within you - in the midst of." (from Scofield Bible Notes, PC Study Bible formatted electronic database Copyright © 2012 by Biblesoft, Inc. All rights reserved.)

John Martin says:

"Luke 17:20-21 First, He said that the Pharisees would not be able to tell of the coming of the kingdom through their observations. Second, he told them that the kingdom was in their midst. The term within you is often misunderstood. The Pharisees were rejecting Him as the Messiah and were not believers. Thus it would not make sense for Jesus to have told the Pharisees that the kingdom of God was within them as if it were some sort of spiritual kingdom. It is better to translate the phrase "within you" (entoshymon) as 'in your midst.' Some feel that the force of the expression is 'within your possession or within your reach.' Jesus' point was that He was standing right in their midst. All they needed to do was acknowledge that He is indeed the Messiah who could bring in the kingdom - and then the kingdom would come."

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Great Principle of Interpretation

- If you have enumerable clear passages stating a truth and one passage that at first reading says something else, what do you do?
- You conclude that you don't understand the conflicting passage and seek to know what it really says.
