

## 2-3 Year Olds

**Bible Story:** "Moses and Aaron Keep Trying," pp. 82-85

**Topic:** The Plagues

**Memory Verse:** - "And my God will meet all your needs." Philippians 4:19

**Group Activity:** Read the book Jump Frog, Jump, then allow the children to help put pictures from the story in order.

<b>Art:</b> Per child: 9x12 blue construction paper 8 small die-cut frogs 4 light green lily pads	Children make a picture by gluing green frogs and yellow lily pads on blue construction paper.
<b>Blocks:</b> 3 round pieces of green felt "lily pads" 3 bean bags made out of frog material	Children play a game called "Lily Pad Toss" by throwing bean bags at green felt "lily pads."
<b>Home Living:</b> 4 frog masks 2 green pull-over costumes Number cards (1-10) and 10 numbered lily pads	Children dress up like frogs and play a hopping game. Children draw a number from the number card and then hop to the "lily pad" with that number.
<b>Puzzles/Games:</b> 1.) 1 die, 2 plastic frogs, 1 lily pad game 2.) Hopping Frogs in a Bucket Game 3.) Frog Matching Game 4.) Plague Bingo 5.) Insect puzzle (laminated)	Teachers help children play with puzzles and games
<b>Nature/Science:</b> Poster of the life cycle of a frog Sample of thumb print art Green stamp pad 1 paper plate ½ sheet of copy paper per child	Children first look at a poster of the life cycle of a frog, then make a green thumb print and draw features to make it look like a frog.
<b>Books:</b>	Teacher and children read the story books
