God Rescues His People

Children's Discovery Bible pp. 88-91

When Moses and the Hebrew people left Egypt, they did not know the way to the new land God promised them. But they knew God would lead them. They knew nothing was too hard for God.

God sent a big cloud to lead His people in the daytime. At night the cloud glowed like fire and gave them light to see by. The people followed the cloud. Soon they came to the Red Sea. They put up tents to rest there.

But then the people heard some sounds. It was the Egyptian army! The king had sent his men to make the Hebrews go back to Egypt.

The Hebrew people were afraid when they saw the Egyptians coming. The Red Sea was in front of them, and they had no boats they could use to cross it. "Do not be afraid," said Moses. "God will keep us safe." He knew nothing was too hard for God.
