Art: White flag die cut for each child Star stickers – about 10 per child Small craft sticks or straws Red crayon or marker Tacky glue	Children make a "banner" flag by decorating a flag die-cut with stickers and by drawing red stripes. Glue to a craft stick or staple to a straw.
Blocks: 1 set of large Lego blocks or other blocks	Children build wall with blocks and then try to knock it down, like the walls of Jericho.

God Wins a Battle

Children's Discovery Bible pp. 108-111

Joshua and the Hebrew people came into the new land of Canaan. They found out that most of the people living there were their enemies.

The great city of Jericho was near the Jordan River. It had high, stone walls all around it. The king of Jericho was not happy to see the Hebrews coming. "We will fight them if they get too close," he told his soldiers.

Joshua knew that Jericho was an enemy city. God told him, "You will have to fight the people of Jericho, but do not be afraid. I will help you win the battle."
